- Larger study on AI subject cataloging













# Subject Cataloging

- Analysis of "aboutness"
- Translation into subject headings
- Requires comprehension of complex resources
- ... and fluency in systems representing subject and genre
- Library of Congress Subject Headings (LCSH)



## Methodology



- Test derived from second edition of Broughton's Essential Classification (2015)
  - 5 exercises
  - 50 questions total
- ChatGPT, Gemini, Copilot
- Responses checked using Classification
   Web, The Subject Headings Manual,
   Free Floating Subdivisions

## **Example**

Broughton (2015), p. 142:

#### **Exercise 13.4.11**

Construct headings using free-floating subdivisions for the following title:

The artful teapot: exhibition held May 16-Sept. 2, 2002, at COPIA: the American Center for Wine, Food, and the Arts, Napa, Calif. and other locations

**Answer:** Teapots--Exhibitions.

#### Example

#### **Prompt**

Using Library of Congress Subject Headings construct subject headings using free-floating subdivisions for the following title: "The artful teapot: exhibition held May 16-Sept. 2, 2002, at COPIA: the American Center for Wine, Food, and the Arts, Napa, Calif. And other locations"

#### **Example**

#### **ChatGPT Response**

To construct Library of Congress Subject Headings (LCSH) with free-floating subdivisions for the title "The artful teapot: exhibition held May 16-Sept. 2, 2002, at COPIA: the American Center for Wine, Food, and the Arts, Napa, Calif. and other locations," we can use appropriate subdivisions that are not tied to specific subject headings. Here are some possibilities:

- 1. Teapots—Exhibitions (Correct)
- 2. Tea culture (Invalid)
- 3. Art—Exhibitions (Valid)
- 4. Pottery—Exhibitions (Valid)
- 5. Crafts—Exhibitions (Invalid)
- 6. Exhibition catalogs (Valid)

# **Common Incorrect Responses**

	ChatGPT (n=23)	Copilot (n=45)	Gemini (n=33)
Incorrect topic	1	1	2
LCSH does not exist	5	26	19
LCSH too broad	2	2	3
LCSH too narrow	3	1	8
LCSH lacking subdivision	11	15	0
Incorrect geographic subdivision	1	0	1

# **All Proposed Headings**

	ChatGPT	Copilot	Gemini
Total LCSH provided	298	125	133
Total valid LCSH provided	189	65	64
Percentage valid	63%	52%	48%
Average number of LCSH provided per book	6.0	2.5	2.9
Average number of valid LCSH provided per book	3.8	1.3	1.4

#### **Oddities**

Using title as a subject heading

American Funeral Vehicles, 1900-2003: An Illustrated History \$x History \$y 20th century \$z United States

Anything can happen in square brackets!

**Choctaw legends [Thunderstorms]** 

Unrelated hallucinations

North-South Dialogue (for the book "The Lawfulness of Deep Seabed Mining")

#### **Takeaways**

- All three tools performed inadequately—for now
- ChatGPT noticeably better than other AI tools
- Cataloger oversight needed:
  - Double check heaing exists
  - 2. Verify heading means what the tool claims
  - 3. Verify nothing more specific is available

#### Conclusion

- Utility in subject heading assignment not indiciated
- Continued importance of human fluency in subject cataloging
- Ongoing assessment required as tools continue to develop
