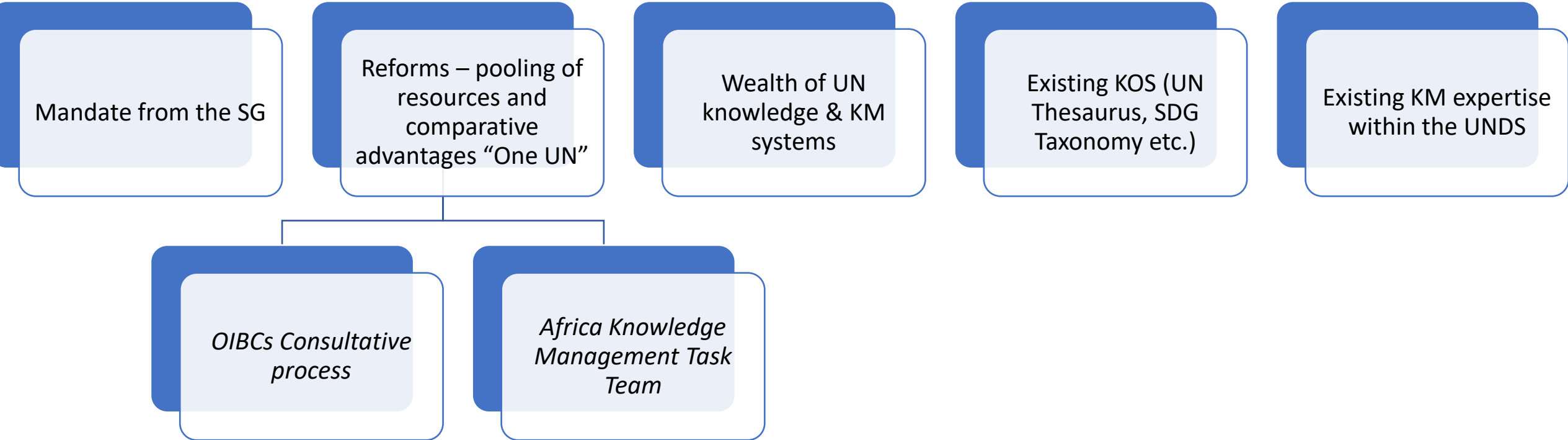
- KM to improve capabilities to generate, retain, use and share knowledge & collaborative approach for a common and accessible knowledge base

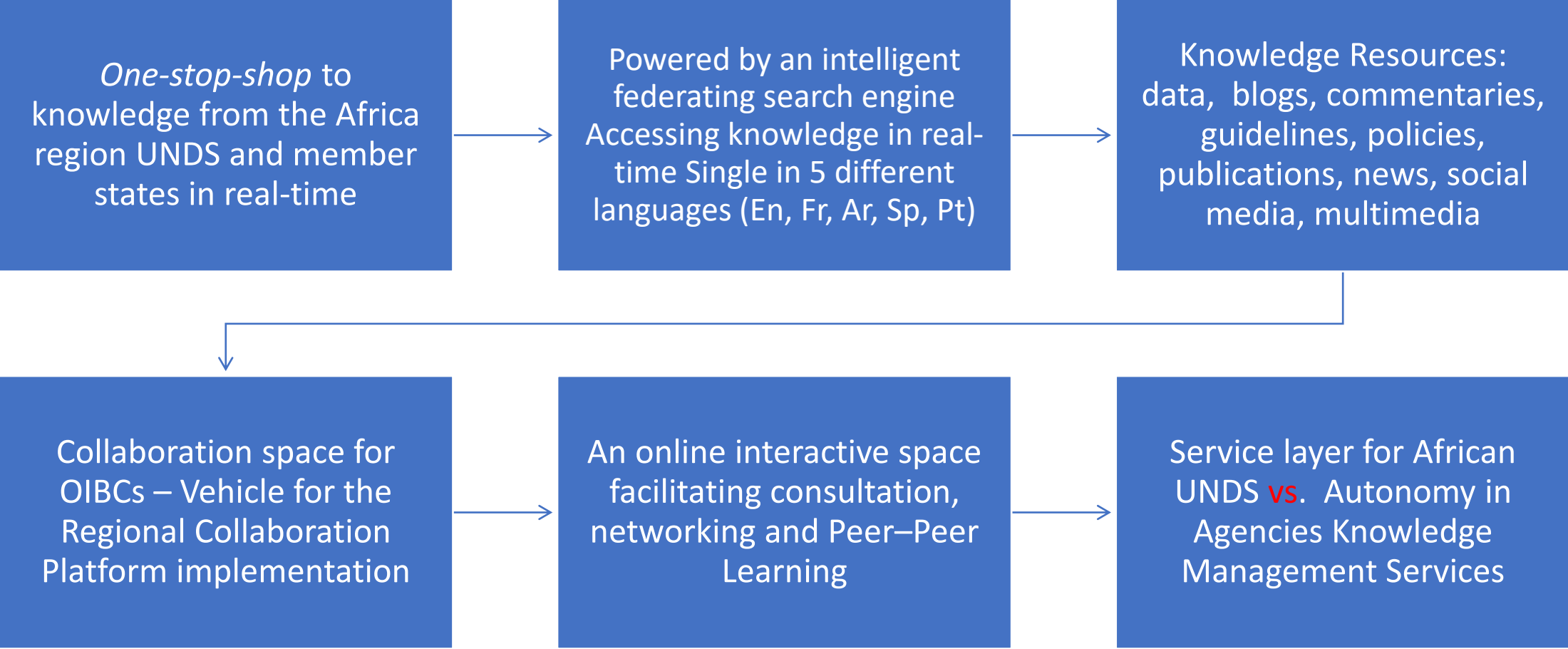

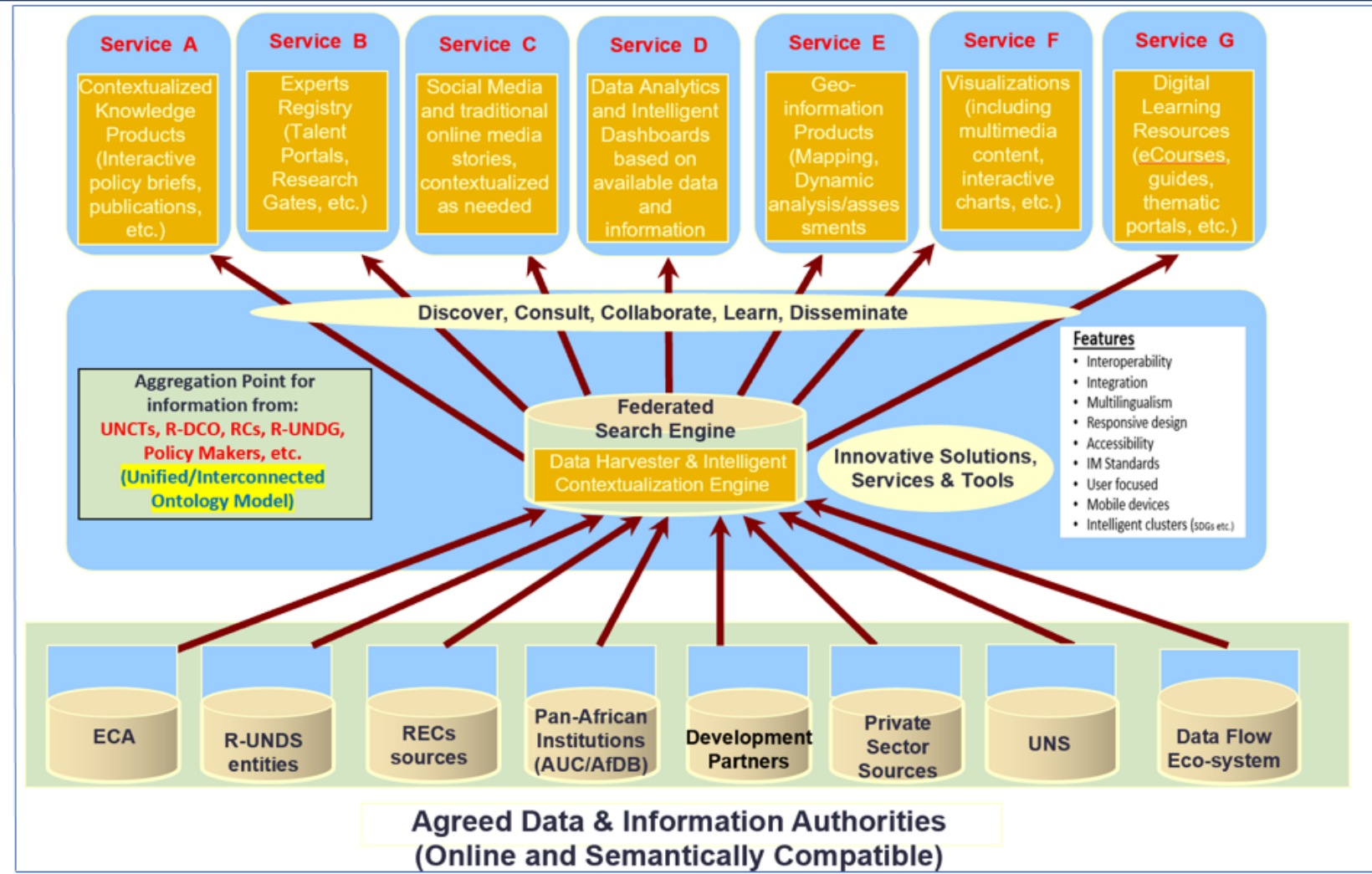

The SDG Taxonomy is developed by the DESA, United Nations ensuring:

- a system of Internationalized Resource Identifiers (IRIs) linking the SDGs Goals, Targets, Indicators, and related data series
- a UN-wide knowledge ecosystem based on Linked Open Data (LOD) principles

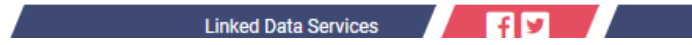
The identifier facilitate use of the Semantic Web technologies:

- Facilitating accessibility, inter-operability & re-usable of SDG data and knowledge assets
- Organically discover relevant and authoritative SDG data and knowledge online
- Develop applications that integrate authoritative data, concepts and definitions e.g. *ASKIA FSE*
